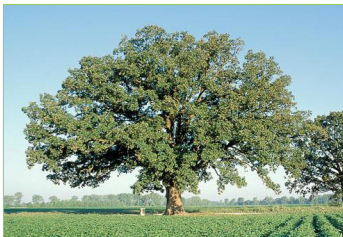

## Bur Oak

(*Quercus macrocarpa*)

Native to Nebraska, Bur Oak grows on a wide variety of sites and best on rich, moist bottomlands. It has a slow to moderate growth rate and is drought tolerant.



Excellent tree for wildlife habitat plantings. It is less susceptible to oak wilt than northern red oak and has no serious insect problems. Oaks may need protection from deer when young.

**Height at maturity: 35-45'**

**Spacing within rows: 16-22'**

**Spacing between rows: 16-24'**

## Centennial Cotoneaster

(*Cotoneaster integerrimus*)

Centennial Cotoneaster has large quantities of bright rosy-red berries that mature in early August and contrast strikingly with dark, lustrous foliage.

Centennial is less susceptible to fireblight, which is fatal to Peking/hedge cotoneaster.

Used in multiple-row farmstead and single-row field windbreaks, and for wildlife habitat. Performs well on a variety of soils.

**Height at maturity: 8-12'**

**Spacing within rows: 6-10'**

**Spacing between rows: 4-5'**

## Swamp White Oak

(*Quercus bicolor*)

Swamp White Oak is native to central and southern United States.

Grows best on moist, bottomland forested soils.

Valuable for wildlife habitat and for its wood. The wood is used in fine furniture, flooring and wine casks.

**Height at maturity: 30-60'**

**Spacing within rows: 16-22'**

**Spacing between rows: 16-24'**



## Midwest Crabapple

(*Malus baccata* var. *Mandshurica*)

Medium-sized tree with rounded crown. Extremely hardy & disease resistant. Small apples 1/4"-1/2"; excellent wildlife food through fall and winter.



White blossoms attractive during the spring. Good for single row windbreaks and between the central and outside rows of multi-row windbreaks.



**Height at maturity: 12-16'**

**Spacing within rows: 8-12'**

**Spacing between rows: 12-16'**

## Black Chokeberry

(*Aronia melanocarpa*)

Adaptable shrub with wide tolerance for soil textures and moisture conditions. Used for erosion control, windbreaks and wet soils.

High-antioxidant fruit used in baking and jams, jellies, syrup, tea, juice and wine. Fruit serves as food source for birds and other wildlife. Spring: showy white flower clusters. Autumn: leaves change from green to vibrant tones of red, orange and purple.



**Height at maturity: 4-8'**

**Spacing within rows: 6-10'**

**Spacing between rows: 12-16'**
