Board Meeting Minutes January 26, 2023

CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Mick Reynolds called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. He reported that the NRD abides by the Open Meetings Act in conducting business and said that a copy of the Open Meetings Act was displayed on the south wall of the conference room, that the Board reserves the right to change the order of an item on the agenda, and some items on the agenda are subject to closed session.

MEETING NOTICES: Chairman Reynolds reported that the notices of the meeting had been published in the Grand Island Independent and the news release was provided to other media outlets in the District.

MEETING MINUTES: Marvion Reichert made the motion to approve the December board meeting minutes. Alicia Haussler seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor, except Lon Bohn, Ed Kyes, Deb VanMatre, and Jerry Wiese who abstained. Motion carried.

ANNOUNCEMENTS & OTHER BUSINESS FOR FUTURE MEETINGS:

Chairman Reynolds asked if there were any announcements or suggestions for future meetings. There was none.

PUBLIC FORUM: Chairman Reynolds asked if anyone wanted to address the board on any item not included on the agenda.

Matt McGuire, 15346 W Barrows Rd, Kenesaw NE 68956. He was upset at the number of landowners taking out trees for habitat and voiced his concern about the potential new Educational/Office building for Central Platte NRD.

EXCUSED ABSENCES: Chairman Reynolds reported that Brian Keiser requested to be excused from the board meeting.

Marvion Reichert made the motion to approve the absence as requested. Alicia Haussler seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

NRCS REPORT: Jacob Kendrick, NRCS Resource Conservationist, introduced Laura Rubeck, the new Soil Conservationist in Central City. Kendrick also reviewed the EQIP applications for Merrick County and the upcoming Eastern NE Soil Health Conference (see enclosed).

Joe Krolikowski, NRCS District Conservationist, reported on the EQIP applications across Nebraska (see enclosed).

NOMINATING COMMITTEE: Reichert reviewed the subcommittee's recommendation that was reported at last month's board meeting to elect Mick Reynolds as chairman and Jerry Wiese as vice-chairman. Both would serve a second two-year term.

Chairman Reynolds asked whether there were any nominations from the floor. There were none.

Marvion Reichert made a motion that nominations close and to elect Mick Reynolds as Chairman and Jerry Wiese as Vice-Chairman. Deb VanMatre seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor except Mick Reynolds and Jerry Wiese who abstained. Motion carried.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT: Mick Reynolds, chairman, reported that the building information has been put on drop box for all the directors to review. This will be discussed at the next board meeting. If any questions in the meantime, contact Lyndon or Jesse.

WATER UTILIZATON COMMITTEE: Tom Downey, chairman, reported that the committee had met earlier today.

Downey said the committee reviewed Amendment #2 for the Groundwater Management Plan Update from Olsson Inc. The amendment adds \$5,000 to the initial cost due to staff

and directors asking for additional information.

Marvion Reichert made a motion to approve the Groundwater Management Plan Update Amendment #2 with Olsson Inc in the amount of \$5,000. Tom Downey seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

Downey said the committee reviewed an amended deed of conservation easement. The original easements stated that no deep-rooted vegetation could be grown on dryland. After reviewing this with the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources, they agreed that they didn't have a preference on what was grown on dryland. After some discussion with the committee, it was recommended to allow the Central Platte NRD staff to sign an amendment to remove the no deep-rooted vegetation from current conservation easements and future conservation easements.

Currently the Central Platte NRD has signed 76 conservation easements. Forty-five of those conservation easements have the no sub-irrigated crops clause. Staff will explore the proper procedures for addressing this amendment with partners.

Tom Downey made a motion to approve the Central Platte NRD staff to sign an amendment to remove the no deep-rooted vegetation from the current conservation easements and remove the clause from any future conservation easements. Marvion Reichert seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

Downey reported that the Platte-Republican Interbasin Transfer, which several NRD's were involved in, the appeal in the decision of no standing. The committee is asking the board to ratify the action of the executive committee to appeal the standing decision that CPNRD doesn't have on the Platte-Republican Division application by the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources.

Tom Downey made a motion to ratify the action of the executive committee to appeal the no standing determination by the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources regarding the Platte-Republican Diversion Project. Marvion Reichert seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

MANAGERS REPORT: Lyndon Vogt, General Manager, reported that the Perkins County Canal is being fully funded in the upcoming budget.

The Groundwater Management Plan is currently being reviewed by DNR and we are hoping to get it back in the next couple of weeks.

Reminder of the board retreat on February 9, 2023.

NEBRASKA CLASS PARTICIPATION RESOLUTION: Lyndon Vogt, General

Manager, reviewed a resolution that would allow the Central Platte NRD to become a participant of the Nebraska Class Trust to invest money with other public agencies.

Jim Bendfeldt made a motion to approve the Nebraska Class Participation Resolution. Tom Downey seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor except Jerry Milner who voted no. Motion carried.

COST SHARE PROGRAMS: Transfer & Applications - Kelly Cole, Administrative Assistant, requested a transfer of \$9,500 from Phragmites Control and putting \$2,500 to Center Pivots and \$7,000 to Trees and reported that we have received cost share applications for the following programs: Center Pivot, Burn Preparation, Tree Planting, and Well Decommissioning (see enclosed). She said the applicants are in compliance with the District's rules and regulations, funds are available, and she recommended they be approved.

Marvion Reichert made the motion to approve the cost share transfer and applications as reported. Keith Ostermeier seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT: The December financial report was not available at last month's board meeting because the meeting was held a week early. Lyndon Vogt, General Manager, reviewed the December and January financial reports.

Marvion Reichert made a motion to approve the December and January financial reports as presented. Alicia Haussler seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

NEBRASKA ASSOCIATION OF RESOURCES DISTRICT: Jim Bendfeldt reported that the Legislative Conference held earlier this week in Lincoln had over 350 attendees. There was a total of 44 bills that were reviewed, however, none of those bills were of any great concern to the NRD's.

Bendfeldt reported that the Risk Pool fund is over \$1,000,000.00 in the black on the first 6 months of this fiscal year.

Bendfeldt also reported that due to personal reasons he has stepped down from the NARD Board as of January 25, 2023.

Bendfeldt announced his resignation from the Central Platte NRD Board of Directors due to personal reasons effective at the close of today's meeting. As a result of Bendfeldt stepping down it was suggested that Deb VanMatre be appointed to take his spot on the NARD Board of Directors.

Jim Bendfeldt made a motion to appoint Deb VanMatre as the next Central Platte NRD NARD Representative. Alicia Haussler seconded the motion. All board members

present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor except Deb VanMatre who abstained. Motion carried.

NATURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION: No Report

UPCOMING EVENTS: Chairman Reynolds reviewed the upcoming events. **Next Board Meeting** – Scheduled for the afternoon of Thursday, February 23. Details to follow.

OTHER BUSINESS: There was none.

ADJOURN: Chairman Reynolds adjourned the board meeting at 2:52 p.m.

January Report to CPNRD

Attached is a summary of the FY 2023 Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) initial allocations to each Natural Resources District in Nebraska. The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) has begun preparing the applications for assessment and ranking that were received by the November 18th application cutoff date. The ranking deadline for all eligible applications in the state and special initiative ranking pools is set for January 31st, the ranking deadline for local ranking pools is set for February 21st. Following the ranking of these applications, contract offers will be extended immediately to the highest ranked applications so that fund obligation can be completed as early as possible in FY 2023. Currently the obligation deadline for all approved applications is set for April 1st. Like we have discussed in the past, the actual contracting period can extend until the end of the Governments Fiscal Year, which is September 30th. We always try to do our best to complete this work as early as possible each year, but this depends on funds availability.
