MEETING MINUTES: Alicia Haussler made the motion to approve the February board meeting minutes. Marvion Reichert seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor, except Lon Bohn, Tom Downey and Ed Kyes who abstained. Motion carried.

PUBLIC FORUM: Chairman Reynolds asked if anyone wanted to address the board on any item not included on the agenda. There were none.

EXCUSED ABSENCES: Chairman Reynolds reported that Jim Bendfeldt requested to be excused from the board meeting.

Marvion Reichert made the motion to approve the absences as requested. Alicia Haussler seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

HEALTH & WATER QUALITY RESEARCH: Jesse Bell, PhD and Director of the Claire M Hubbard Professor of Water, Climate and Health Program at the University of Nebraska Medical Center presented to the board the Water Quality Impacts on Human Health. Bell reported that Nebraska has one of the highest rates of pediatric cancer in the nation.

NRCS REPORT: Joe Krolikowski, NRCS District Conservationist, reported on the applications that the Grand Island Field office is currently working on and provided information on the new State Conservationist (see attached).

EASTERN PROJECTS: Charles Maser, chairman, reported that the Eastern Projects Committee met earlier today and started to review the 2023 Fiscal Year Budget.

WESTERN PROJECTS: Ryan Kegley, chairman, reported that the Western Projects Committee met earlier today and started to review the 2023 Fiscal Year Budget.

PROGRAMS COMMITTEE: Deb VanMatre, chairman, reported that the Programs Committee met earlier today.

VanMatre reported that we received two Urban Conservation Applications. One was from the Lexington Patriot Park and Pond, however, on this one the committee is requesting more information before they bring it to the board. The second application was from the Cairo North Ball Field, this application would fund a new bathroom. The estimated cost was \$113,500 and they requested \$40,000. The committee is recommending providing them with \$20,000, as this falls under the priorities currently accepted for this program.

Deb VanMatre made a motion to approve the Urban Conservation application for the Cairo North Ball field in the amount of \$20,000. Alicia Haussler seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor, except LeRoy Arends who voted no. Motion carried.

VanMatre indicated that the committee will review our current Urban Conservation Assistance Program and its priorities and may bring changes to the board to approve.

VanMatre also reported that the committee began reviewing the 2023 Cost Share Budget and the 2023 Information/Education Budget.

VIOLATIONS REPORT: Luke Zakrzewski, GIS Image Analyst, reported that on February 18, 2022, 50 violation letters were sent out. The landowners had until March 2, 2022, to contact him to resolve the issue. At this time landowners Richard Urban of Polk County and Chad Robinson of Dawson County have made no effort to contact Central Platte NRD. Luke is requesting Urban, and Robinson be issued Cease & Desist orders.

Doug Reeves made a motion to issue Cease & Desist orders to Richard Urban of Polk County and Chad Robinson of Dawson County due to irrigating acres that are not certified as irrigated. Jay Richeson seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

MANAGER'S REPORT: Lyndon Vogt, General Manager, reported on the fire we had on the Prairie/Silver/Moores project. The fire burnt about 50 acres. There was minimal damage to some equipment we had out there.

Vogt reported on the upcoming GMDA conference that is being held June 20-22 in Colorado. Please contact Kelly if you're interested in attending.

COST SHARE PROGRAMS: Transfer & Applications – Kelly Cole, Administrative Assistant, requested a transfer of \$5,100 from Grazing Deferment to Trees and reported that we have received cost share applications for the following programs: Burn Preparation, Tree Planting, Grazing Deferment and Well Decommissioning (see attached). She said the applicants are in compliance with the district's rules and regulations, funds are available, and she recommended they be approved.

Tom Downey made the motion to approve the cost share transfer and applications as reported. Marvion Reichert seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Lyndon Vogt, General Manager, reviewed the March financial report.

Marvion Reichert made a motion to approve the March financial report as presented. Deb VanMatre seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.
