**MEETING NOTICES:** Chairman Reynolds reported that the notices of the meeting had been published in the Grand Island Independent and the news release was provided to other media outlets in the District.

**MEETING MINUTES:** Marvion Reichert made the motion to approve the August board meeting minutes. Keith Ostermeier seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor, except Alicia Haussler and Doug Reeves who abstained. Motion carried.

## ANNOUNCEMENTS & OTHER BUSINESS FOR FUTURE MEETINGS:

Chairman Reynolds asked if there were any announcements or suggestions for future meetings. There were none.

**PUBLIC FORUM:** Chairman Reynolds asked if anyone wanted to address the board on any item not included on the agenda. There were none.

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**EXCUSED ABSENCES**: Chairman Reynolds reported that Tom Downey, Ryan Kegley, Brian Keiser, Dwayne Margritz, Steve Sheen, Deb VanMatre, and Jerry Wiese requested to be excused from the board meeting.

Marvion Reichert made the motion to approve the absences as requested. Alicia Haussler seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

**NRCS REPORT:** Joe Krolikowski, NRCS District Conservationist, reported on the FY 2021 EQIP activity and timeline for FY 2022 applications (see enclosed).

**MANAGERS REPORT:** Lyndon Vogt, General Manager, reviewed the managers' report.

Central Platte NRD is about 95% complete with construction on the Gibbon Crane Deck. September 15 begins the fall crane migration season; therefore, work must stop until mid-November. Signage and seeding will be completed in late November.

The Burn Plan Position has been advertised twice now, 4 individuals have been interviewed, but Central Platte NRD has had no luck in filling the position. Central Platte NRD is still currently looking to fill the opening.

The next Integrated Management Plan trigger is in 2023. The Platte Basin NRDs met with the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources to discuss the Robust Review. The mitigation activity that Central Platte NRD is required to do by 2023, we have more than meet.

The Lower Wood River WFPO update is located on Drop Box with some of the alternatives that have been looked at for flooding in the Watersheds. More details will be discussed at future board meetings.

STAFF PRESENTATIONS: Deb Jarzynka, District Secretary, Marcia Lee, Information/Education Specialist and Brody Vorderstrasse, Communications Assistant presented to the board on their job duties at the Central Platte NRD.

**PRECISION CONSERVATION MANAGEMENT REPORT:** Morgan Wrich, Precision Conservation Specialist, reported that she has started meeting with growers and signing them up to implement cover crops in Dawson County.

**VARIANCE/APPEAL COMMITTEE:** Jim Bendfeldt reported that the variance and appeals sub-committee meet today at noon for a variance request. The request was from Doug Anderson to transfer 2.31 acres of land from the NW ½ 20-12N-6W, which is in the Upper Big Blue, to the NW ½ 17-12N-6W, which is in the Central Platte NRD, located within Hamilton County. Given that both sections are directly adjacent to each

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other and the Upper Big Blue NRD has approved the transfer request, the subcommittee is recommending that the acre for acre transfer request be approved.

Jim Bendfeldt made the motion to approve the transfer of 2.31 acres of land from the NW ½ 20-12N-6W, which is in the Upper Big Blue, to the NW ¼ 17-12N-6W, which is in the Central Platte NRD, located within Hamilton County for Doug Anderson. Marvion Reichert seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

**DROUGHT MITIGATION PRESENTATION:** Becky Appleford, JEO Engineering Hazard Mitigation and Emergency Planner, presented Central Platte NRD's Drought Mitigation Plan to the board. JEO developed the Plan as a resource for mitigation and response during periods of drought. Appleford indicated that the US Drought Monitor is a key tool to defining drought locally.

Appleford indicated that the next step would be to incorporate this Drought Mitigation Plan into the Central Platte NRD's Hazard Mitigation Plan, Integrated Management Plan and the Groundwater Management Plan. As well as implement proposed projects and utilize the extreme events committee.

**BUILDING COMMITTEE:** Lyndon Vogt, General Manager, presented a short video to the board on some information on a possible educational/office building. More information will be brought back at our December board meeting.

LONG RANGE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN UPDATES: Marcia Lee, Information/Education Specialist, reported that the proposed 2021-2026 Long Range Implementation Plan is on Drop Box. There were no recommended changes from the board from last month. She requested approval to send the Long Range Implementation Plan onto The Nebraska Department of Natural Resources.

Alicia Haussler made the motion to approve the 2021-2026 Long Range Implementation Plan as presented and send to The Nebraska Department of Natural Resources. Keith Ostermeier seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

COST SHARE PROGRAMS: Applications –Kelly Cole, Administrative Assistant, reported that we have received cost share applications for the following programs: Nebraska Soil and Water Conservation, Center Pivot, Flow Meter and Cover Crop (see enclosed). She said the applicants are in compliance with the District's rules and regulations, funds are available, and she recommended they be approved.

Alicia Haussler made the motion to approve the cost share applications as reported. Keith Ostermeier seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

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**FINANCIAL REPORT:** Lyndon Vogt, General Manager, briefly reviewed the September financial reports.

Alicia Haussler made a motion to approve the September financial report as presented. Charles Maser seconded the motion. All board members present, voting by roll call vote, were in favor. Motion carried.

**Limited Resource Farmer or Rancher** – The term "Limited Resource Farmer or Rancher" means a participant:

- With direct or indirect gross farm sales not more than the current indexed value in each of the previous two years, and
- Who has a total household income at or below the national poverty level for a family of four, or less than 50 percent of county median household income in each of the previous two years.

A legal entity or joint operation can be a Limited Resource Farmer or Rancher only if all individual members independently qualify. A Self-Determination Tool is available to the public and may be completed on-line or printed and completed hardcopy at: <a href="https://lrftool.sc.egov.usda.gov/">https://lrftool.sc.egov.usda.gov/</a>

**Beginning Farmer or Rancher** – The term "Beginning Farmer or Rancher" means a participant who:

- Has not operated a farm or ranch, or who has operated a farm or ranch for not more than 10 consecutive years. This requirement applies to all members of a legal entity, and who
- Will materially and substantially participate in the operation of the farm or ranch.

In the case of a contract with an individual, individually or with the immediate family, material and

substantial participation requires that the individual provide substantial day-to-day labor and management of the farm or ranch, consistent with the practices in the county or State where the farm is located.

In the case of a contract made with a legal entity, all members must materially and substantially participate in the operation of the farm or ranch. Material and substantial participation requires that the members provide some amount of the management, or labor and management necessary for day-to-day activities, such that if the members did not provide these inputs, operation of the farm or ranch would be seriously impaired.

**Socially Disadvantaged Farmer or Rancher** – The term "Socially Disadvantaged" means an individual or entity who is a member of a socially disadvantaged group. For an entity, at least 50 percent ownership in the farm business must be held by socially disadvantaged individuals. A socially disadvantaged group is a group whose members have been subject to racial or ethnic prejudice because of their identity as members of a group without regard to their individual qualities.

These groups consist of the following:

- · American Indians or Alaskan Natives
- Asians
- Blacks or African Americans
- Native Hawaiians or other Pacific Islanders
- Hispanics.

Note: Gender alone is not a covered group for the purposes of NRCS conservation programs. The term entities reflect a broad interpretation to include partnerships, couples, legal entities, etc.

**Veteran Farmer or Rancher** – The term "Veteran Farmer or Rancher" means a producer who served in the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, or Coast Guard, including the reserve component thereof; was released from service under conditions other than dishonorable; and:

- has not operated a farm or ranch, or has operated a farm or ranch for not more than 10 years;
- who first obtained status as a veteran during the most recent 10-year period.

A legal entity or joint operation can be a Veteran Farmer or Rancher only if all individual members independently qualify.

It is the responsibility of the Participant to provide accurate information to support all items addressed in this application at the request of NRCS. False certifications are subject to criminal and civil fraud statutes.

The Participant acknowledges that highly erodible land conservation/wetland conservation, adjusted gross income certifications, and member information for entities and joint operations are on file with the FSA.
